What is the CGFM?



The Mark of Excellence for Government Financial Professionals

March, 2016

CGFM is a professional certification recognizing the unique skills and special knowledge required of today's government financial managers. It covers governmental accounting, auditing, financial reporting, internal controls and budgeting at the federal, state and local levels.

Interested in the CGFM Certification?

You will need to study for the exams!

The Ozarks AGA has a set of current study guides available for checkout—one book at a time for 2 months at a time. They are in three separate three-ring binders – one for each section.

If you are interested in borrowing one of the study guides, would like to participate in a study group, or have questions about the CGFM program, please notify Tina McManus at <u>tinamcmanus@missouristate.edu</u> and she will answer any questions you have, or arrange for you to check it out when it becomes available.

One of the benefits of being a member of our Ozarks Chapter is that we will reimburse you for the successful passing of the CGFM exam in its entirety if you meet qualifications. Also—members receive a \$29 discount off the price of the application fee!

CGFM FAQ: What book can I buy to study for the examinations?

A: AGA has (3) study guides to help you study for the three CGFM examinations. These can be purchased from the National AGA website. However, Ozarks AGA has these study guides available to check out for FREE—see Tina McManus's info above.

CGFM FAQ: Are there sample examination questions?

A: Yes, sample CGFM examinations questions are available in the <u>Examination Requirement</u> section of the National website.

Maintaining CGFM Certifications

- Pay the CGFM renewal fee of \$30 for members and \$65 for non-members, by March 31st.
- Complete at least 80 hours of CPE every 2 years in government financial management topics or related technical subjects.
- Maintain and, if requested by AGA, provide detailed information on CPE hours completed.

If retired or inactive, contact a CEC member or the national AGA office to inquire about CGFM renewal requirements.

Secretary – Jody Vernon:

The minutes of the January 28, 2016 CEC meeting were approved with no changes.

Treasurer – Justin Dement:

Justin is checking into the detail of some chapter dues revenue.

The Treasurer's report for February was presented and approved.

Accountability – Jamie Rouch:

No report.

Education – Rachel McGinnis:

The February meeting on grants was well attended.

All speakers are confirmed for the spring seminar. If possible the presentations will be sent to attendees prior to the seminar.

We will set a date for the fall seminar in order to book some of the speakers who were unable to present at the spring seminar.

- National AGA contacted Rachel about an officer visit/presentation at a seminar or monthly meeting during the next program year. We will discuss this matter in more detail at the next CEC meeting.
- The Drury college students attending the spring seminar will be able to participate in the snack and soda breaks. The chapter will absorb the additional costs which should be around \$1 per person.
- The MSU Chinese Executive Option MBA program students are interested in getting involved with local professional organizations. The CEC voted to offer 10 seats for the first half of the spring seminar and 10 seats for the last half of the spring seminar at a rate of \$50 per person with lunch included. For regular monthly meetings in April and May, 10 seats will be offered at the standard non-member rate of \$15 per person. This will be considered a pilot program for the rest of the program year, and then a decision will be made on whether to continue this arrangement going forward.

National AGA is planning to host local chapter websites. December is the tentative goal for this to take place. We will keep the chapter website as is until national AGA makes a decision and we receive cost information.

Community Service – Linda Charles:

Two people have joined the Relay for Life team so far.

Early Career – Julie Ravenscraft:

No report.

Membership – Greg Drake:

Thirty-two attended the February meeting including 9 non-members.

Thirty-five have registered for the spring seminar including 2 new members and 1 reinstated member.

Old Business – Wayland Mueller:

- The bylaws were approved by members at the February 18 meeting with 21 out of 22 "Yes" votes and 1 non-vote. The bylaws were forwarded to National AGA for final approval.
- Wayland has been working on the tax-exempt status/990 issue. In order to complete the process, our chapter must files articles of incorporation, adopt bylaws, request tax-exempt status, and file 990-N forms for FY08-FY15. We are now incorporated and the bylaws have been approved by our members. The next step is waiting on National AGA to approve the bylaws.

No update on the directors and officers liability insurance.

Wayland has received 2 valid scholarship applications so far – one from a College of the Ozarks student and one from a Missouri Southern State College student. The deadline is March 11.


