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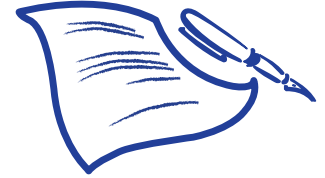

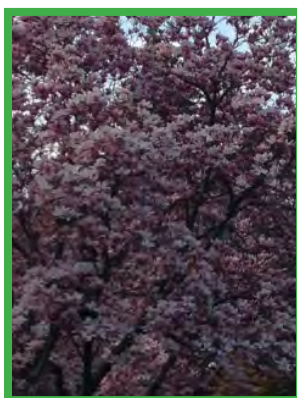
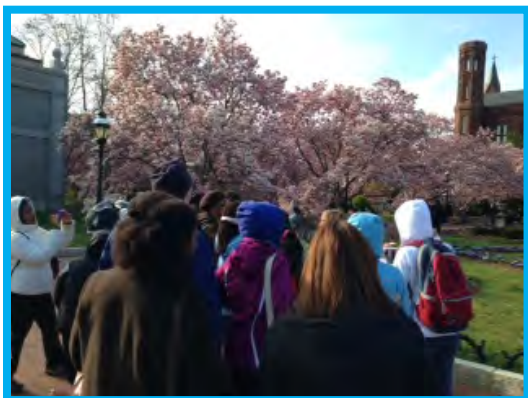
Member Services

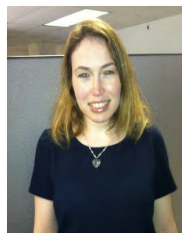

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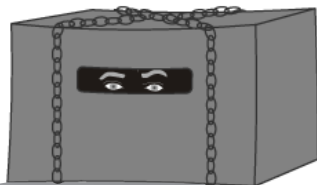
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Inside the Black Box

The Third Alternative

Background

Ever since its inception in 1986, the Standard General Ledger (SGL) has been divided into budgetary and proprietary accounts and entries. In the new Governmentwide Treasury Account Symbol Adjusted Trial Balance System (GTAS), a new flag has been added for Budgetary and Proprietary, which includes the value “A” to indicate the account is reported as both Budgetary and Proprietary (presumably “A” stands for “All”).

SGL Definition

In the SGL posting models and account structure, there is no third alternative. All accounts that begin with a 4 are budgetary accounts which track sources and uses of funding. They are self-balancing, which is to say that whenever a budgetary account is posted for a debit, there must be an offsetting credit to another budgetary account. Proprietary accounts begin with 1, 2, 3, 5, 6, or 7 and are also self-balancing. The SGL also supports memorandum accounts that begin with 8 and again, they are self-balancing. These classifications do not overlap; no account can belong to more than one group. Every SGL transaction is divided into budgetary, proprietary, and memorandum postings where all debit and credit accounts belong to that group. The SGL originally set aside the accounts beginning with 9 for agency use. This is no longer acknowledged, but presumably agencies are still allowed to post to these accounts as long as they are only used for internal reporting.

Reporting

Treasury has been using the Federal Agencies Centralized Trial-balance System (FACTS) for more than a decade. The proprietary and some of the memorandum accounts are reported in FACTS I for use in creating the consolidated Financial Report, while all budgetary and a small number of proprietary accounts are included in FACTS II for generating budgetary reports such as the SF-133 Report on Budget Execution and Budgetary Resources. Both FACTS I and II are being replaced by GTAS, but this means that GTAS will be used for two different types of reports. In order to help segregate the data for these reports, Treasury has added Budgetary/Proprietary Flag.

In general, if the Budgetary/Proprietary Flag is “B” or “A”, then that account was reported in FACTS II, and if the flag is “P” or “A”, it was reported in FACTS I. The proprietary accounts included for FACTS II were generally those used for reconciling cash and investments/debt balances with Treasury. The “A” accounts that were reported in both FACTS I and II include 101000 Fund Balance with Treasury, 112000-113000 cash held outside of Treasury, 119300-119500 special monetary assets, 120500-120900 special foreign currency assets, 134200 Interest Receivable – Investments, 161000-163300 investments, and 167000-167900 foreign

investments. There are a few exceptions. Accounts 164200-165300 for special non-public debt investments were not reported in FACTS II but have a value of "A". Accounts 251000 and 259000 for agency debt were reported in FACTS II but have a value of "P". Also, the memorandum accounts 880100-880400 have a value of "P"; there is no separate value for memorandum accounts.

Conclusion

There has been no change to the basic SGL account and transaction structure: accounts are exclusively proprietary, budgetary, or memorandum. These three groups are still self-balancing. However, in GTAS Treasury has added a Budgetary/Proprietary Flag that is used to indicate the type of reporting for which an account is used for. This flag treats memorandum accounts as proprietary, and also has a limited number of proprietary accounts that are used for both budgetary and proprietary reporting. One should not confuse these two uses of the terms "budgetary" and "proprietary".

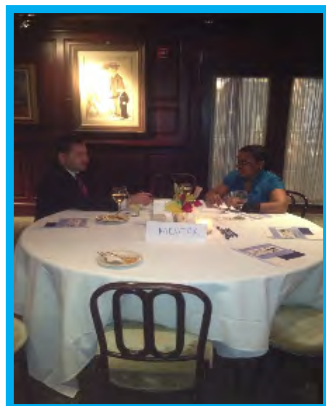
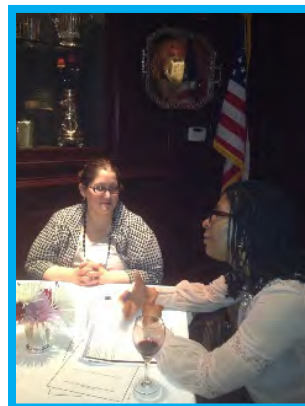
