



**Education Requirement.** A bachelor's degree from an accredited college or university is required to take any of the CGFM examinations.

**Experience Requirement.** Certification candidates must have at least two years of professional-level experience in government financial management prior to designation as a CGFM, The experience is not necessary to sit for the exams; however, documentation of professional experience must be filed and approved by AGA before the CGFM designation can be granted. #### **Inside The Black Box**

#### What is SGL Account 219000 for?

#### Introduction

The Treasury Financial Manual (TFM) gives conflicting guidance on when to post standard general ledger (SGL) account 219000 Other Liabilities with Related Budgetary Obligations.

#### **Payables**

The primary SGL account to be used for funded payables is 211000 Accounts Payable. It has a short life cycle: SGL Transaction B402 and related entries debit an asset or expense and credit 211000, B408 moves the balance to 212000 Disbursements in Transit, and B110 moves that balance to 101000 Fund Balance with Treasury. However, each of these three Transactions definitions show 219000 posting the same way as 211000. Account 211000 is reported on lines 17 and 21 of the balance sheet while 219000 is reported on lines 19 and 27, which means the choice of account does potentially impact financial statements. So when does an agency post 211000 for a liability and when does an agency post 219000?

There are thirteen SGL Transactions that post 219000, and ten of them list 211000 and 219000 as alternatives for the liability: B110, B402, B408, B416, D102, D106, D107, D110, D134, and D308. The only clues given for when to post 219000 are in Transaction B402 which states "Record USSGL account 219000 for grants payable," and the Account Definition for 211000 which states "The amount owed to another ... entity for goods and other property ordered and received, and for services rendered by other than employees." So it sounds like disbursing a grant is not a payment for goods or services received, and so should use a different liability account. This agrees with the description for Transaction E102 for accrued payroll which lists four different liability accounts: 221000 for payroll and leave, 221100 for withholding, 219100 for employee healthcare, and 219000 for grantee expenses (by process of elimination and the description does say "This includes ... grantee expenses").

#### **Other Liabilities**

However, the remaining two Transaction Definitions that list 219000 give different descriptions for this account. Entry D112 (together with D113) reclassify reestimated subsidy expense from unfunded to funded in the financing account. These presume that Transaction B420 was posted earlier as follows:

Debit 680000 Future Funded Expenses Credit 299000 Other Liabilities without Related Budgetary Obligations So when the unfunded liability is funded, entries D112 and D113 together post the following:

Debit 299000 Other Liabilities without Related Budgetary Obligations

619900 Adjustment to Subsidy Expense

461000 Allotments - Realized Resources

Credit 680000 Future Funded Expenses

219000 Other Liabilities with Related Budgetary Obligations

490100 Delivered Orders - Obligations, Unpaid

So it appears that 219000 is to be used for subsidy expense, except that the main entry for subsidy expense is B420 which posts the unfunded 217000 Subsidy Payable to the Financing Account instead, and this is liquidated by entry B105 which records the budgetary expenditure along with the disbursement. So is 219000 supposed to be used both for grants payable and the funded portion of subsidies payable (which is the re-estimated amount)?

A different use is shown by Transaction E108 "for unpaid estimated costs incurred." Its entry is a typical expenditure payable, as follows, but it only lists one option for the liability account:

Debit 610000 Operating Expenses/Program Costs

461000 Allotments - Realized Resources

Credit 219000 Other Liabilities with Related Budgetary Obligations

490100 Delivered Orders - Obligations, Unpaid

This is how I've recommended in the past agencies use 219000: for fund- or agency-wide accruals based on statistics rather than actual receipt of goods and services. However, some of those agencies have told me their auditors insisted that they accrue using 211000.

#### **Conclusion**

The TFM appears to limit the use of 219000 to three cases: paying grants, funded loan subsidy payable, and mass accruals at quarter or year end. For mass accruals, the accrual entry at the end of the ac-count-ing period for 219000 would simply be reversed at the beginning of the next accounting period, and not disbursed as shown in Transactions B408 and B110. So are these disbursement entries only for paying grants and the funded portions of subsidy for loans? And should the disbursement in transit be held in 219000 or 212000, since B408 shows 219000's balance moving to 101000. It would be nice if the definition for account 219000 included specific examples of when this account should be posted instead of 211000 (or 212000).


