Donate Glasses - How You Can Help

Free for You - Priceless to Them

Donate glasses and change someone's life. Imagine if you could help a child read. An adult succeed in his job. A senior maintain her independence. And provide a community with more opportunities to grow and thrive.

Journey of a Pair of Eyeglasses

Donate glasses at the April AGA Meeting.

AGA will take the donated glasses to a collection site.

A box of used eyeglasses is poured out for sorting at the Lions Eyeglass Recycling Center in Muncie, Indiana.

Volunteers sort the used eyeglasses, separating sunglasses, broken frames and single lenses for intact pairs.

Glasses are cleaned and then packaged according to their prescription.

Prepared glasses are stored in the warehouse until they are requested for an eyeglasses dispensing mission.

Volunteers sort glasses in preparation for the first day of the mission.

Hundreds of people wait in line to have their eyes examined and receive a pair of eyeglasses.

A recipient patiently waits his or her turn.

The recipient has his or her hand numbered for ease in going through the various stations.

The first eye test is performed on the recipient using a spoon to cover one eye and a simple wall eye chart.

The recipient has his or her eyes tested using the auto refractor.

The recipient is fitted with the eyeglasses that were donated. After a few adjustments, he or she is able to read clearly.

The glasses will help the recipient maintain employment allowing him or her to continue to support their families.



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

WHEREAS, approximately 75 active members in the Ozarks Chapter of the AGA represent state, federal, municipal, and private sector accountants, auditors, and financial managers; and

WHEREAS, AGA Ozarks Chapter members have responded to the AGA's mission of Advancing Government Accountability, as it continues its broad education efforts, with emphasis on high standards of conduct, honor, and character in its Code of Ethics; and

WHEREAS, they are making significant advances both in professional ability and in service to the citizens of Missouri by mastering increasingly technical and complex requirements; and

WHEREAS, the Certified Government Financial Manager (CGFM) program of AGA provides a means of demonstrating professionalism and competency by requiring CGFM candidates to have appropriate educational and employment history, to abide by AGA's Code of Ethics, and to pass three examinations requiring expertise in Governmental Environment, Governmental Financial Management and Control, and Governmental Accounting, Financial Reporting and Budgeting, and requires each CGFM holder to maintain certification by completing at least 80 hours of continuing professional education in government financial management topics or related technical subjects every two years,

NOW, THEREFORE, I. Robert L. Stephens, Mayor of the City of Springfield, Missouri, do hereby proclaim March 2014 to be
