Our guest speaker, Laura Slatton, presented a program on "Fraud Awareness Briefing". Laura discussed the three sides to the Office of Inspector General's office – audit, investigation, and inspection. She gave information on white collar crime and the differences of criminal – beyond a reasonable double; civil – lower burden of proof; and administration – suspension and disbarment of contractors. Her presentation and the real- life cases provided a great insight into the workings of the Office of Inspector General and specifically fraud.

Alicia closed the meeting by thanking Laura for her presentation. A brief board meeting was held to discuss a representative to AGA's 2019-2020 National Council of Chapters. Amy Paganelli has agreed to be the representative.
