Ethics and Protecting Government Data By

Diane MaKaeli, CEO, Global Business & Financial Services

On September 12, Diane MaKaeli, CEO of Global Business & Financial Services, as well as a member of our chapter board and the AGA's Professional Ethics Board, discussed the role of the AGA in

maintaining ethical standards among its members.

Diane described the Ethics Board and its function. The board is made up of federal and state government representatives as well as private sector members. Diane represents the private sector.

The principal task of the Ethics Board is to respond to questions submitted by members as to the appropriateness of activities in light of the AGA's ethics standards. The Board also reviews reported actions of members, which, after investigation, may be found to be contrary to the AGA's standards. These transgressions may result in a verbal or written warning; remedial action by the member or CGFM, such as additional education; suspension of AGA membership and/or CGFM certification; and termination of AGA membership and/or CGFM certification.

The bulk of questions and alleged improprieties made to the Board are agency policy issues that are best resolved by referring to the agencies' policies and procedures. Examples cited included personal accumulation of frequent flyer benefits from official travel, not attending training programs paid for by the employee's agency, and sharing a hotel room with a spouse while on travel status.

Diane also discussed more serious cases. These tend to revolve around access and dissemination of information. Among Diane's examples was a case where passport data showing the travel performed by political candidates was looked up by government employees out of curiosity, not for a business purpose. Diane pointed out that this type of action tars all government workers as snoops using their official positions for personal purposes, and takes away the public's confidence in the privacy of their own data held by the government.

In closing, Diane commented on how one would think an ethics issue would be clearly within the AGA's standards or not. However, it turns out that the Board often has different opinions of an action, which must then be analyzed and discussed to come to a consensus opinion.
