


Contest details:

CGFM

WHAT IS CGFM?

Certified Government Financial Manager® (CGFM®) is a professional certification recognizing the unique skills and special knowledge required of today's government financial managers. It covers governmental accounting, auditing, financial reporting, internal controls and budgeting at the federal, state and local levels.

To earn the CGFM, individuals must apply for the CGFM program and meet the following requirements:

Ethics — read and agree to abide by AGA's Code of Ethics

Education — have a bachelor's degree from an accredited college or university

Examinations — pass three comprehensive CGFM examinations

Experience — have at least two years of professional-level experience in government financial management

CGFM Examination: Applicants must take and pass three comprehensive examinations to become a CGFM:

- Course 1: Governmental Environment
- Course 2: Governmental Accounting, Financial Reporting and Budgeting
- Course 3: Governmental Financial Management and Control

Technical Updates Corner-FASAB and GASB

Federal Accounting Standards Advisory Board (FASAB)

January 18, 2017—FASAB Issues Statement of Federal Financial Accounting Standards 51, *Insurance Programs*

"The Board is seeking to improve federal financial reporting and to better inform readers about the operating performance of insurance programs and the extent of the risk of loss to the federal government from adverse events," according to Chairman Showalter.

To provide concise, meaningful, and transparent information regarding insurance program costs and liabilities, SFFAS 51 establishes three categories of insurance and related guidance: exchange transaction insurance programs other than life insurance, nonexchange transaction insurance programs, and life insurance programs. SFFAS 51 rescinds existing standards for insurance and guarantee programs in SFFAS 5, *Accounting for Liabilities of The Federal Government*, paragraphs 97-121.

Governmental Accounting Standards Board (GASB)

Norwalk, CT, January 31, 2017—GASB ISSUES STATEMENT NO. 84, FIDUCIARY ACTIVITIES

The objective of this Statement is to improve guidance regarding the identification of fiduciary activities for accounting and financial reporting purposes and how those activities should be reported.

Statement No. 84 establishes criteria for identifying fiduciary activities of all state and local governments. The focus of the criteria generally is on (1) whether a government is controlling the assets of the fiduciary activity and (2) the beneficiaries with whom a fiduciary relationship exists. Separate criteria are included to identify fiduciary component units and postemployment benefit arrangements that are fiduciary activities.

This Statement describes four fiduciary funds that should be reported, if applicable: (1) pension (and other employee benefit) trust funds, (2) investment trust funds, (3) private-purpose trust funds, and (4) custodial funds. Custodial funds generally should report fiduciary activities that are not held in a trust or equivalent arrangement that meets specific criteria.

This Statement also provides for recognition of a liability to the beneficiaries in a fiduciary fund when an event has occurred that compels the government to disburse fiduciary resources. Events that compel a government to disburse fiduciary resources occur when a demand for the resources has been made or when no further action, approval, or condition is required to be taken or met by the beneficiary to release the assets.

Effective Date

The requirements of this Statement are effective for reporting periods beginning after December 15, 2018. Earlier application is encouraged.

The AGA MPG Board Meeting was held on Wednesday, January 4, 2017 at 12:00 pm via Conference Call. The Meeting was called to order at 12:01 PM by Corinne Dougherty.

I. WELCOME AND OPENING REMARKS

- Corinne welcomed everyone to the meeting and turned the discussion over to Mat Wenzel, Secretary, to perform the roll call.

II. REVIEW/VOTE ON MINUTES

- Corinne asked for a motion to approve the meeting minutes from the November 30, 2016 board meeting. Yehuda Schmidt made a motion to approve the minutes and Isaiah Okyere seconded the motion. The minutes were unanimously approved by the Board members. III. PRESENTATION OF BUDGET/WORK PLANS:

A. MEMBERSHIP: Natalie Samuels, Michael Smith, Helena Clemons—Corinne Dougherty informed the board that there were no updates.

- B. EARLY CAREERS: Erica Williams and Dhiren Patel
- Erica informed the board regarding the upcoming bowling event on Thursday, January 26, 2017 in Gaithersburg, MD. She will send an RSVP through email.
- Erica mentioned two options for the upcoming Washington Wizards event on March 22nd. One would be for an all-inclusive food and drink package on the upper level and the other would be for a lower level ticket without the all-inclusive food and drink package. Based on feedback, the board decided to go with the upper level tickets.
- For the January happy hour, Erica informed the board that there were approximately 20-25 attendees and a few people joined the chapter as a result. Feedback suggested that it was a good location and convenient for work.
