At the February 2019 meeting we had the pleasure of have Amelia Hart present to us her version of "What does CAFR say about your Government Efficiency"

Some of the Key Measures were: Net Income; Purpose of the Government; Pre-emble of the Constitution because that is the very thing that got our government started and who cares?

Discussion was mainly on GASB and the changes that they have made to our reporting since GASB 1. One of the biggest changes that GASB made was in their Statement 34. For those of use who have been involved in the adoption to its current state knows that there are more changes to this statement that may force several into retirement.

Does our Government have the following characteristics?

Timeliness – Relevant – Understandability – Comparability – Consistency – and Reliability Amelia discussed some of the important ratios that we should be looking at when we receive our audit:

GWFS (Government Wide Financial Statements)

Unassigned Net Position over total Expenses For the GWFS ratio we want to see a higher ratio

Quick Ratio

Cash & Current Investments over current liabilities For the Quick ratio we want to also see a higher ratio

Solvency Ratio

Total Liability less (Deferred Outs) over Total Assets less (Deferred Ins) For the Solvency Ration we want the ratio at a low rate. We appreciate the presentation from Amelia Hart and look forward to seeing her again.
