Topic: Ethics – two hours CPE

Understanding of Finances

Each year, Saco, Maine, publishes voluminous 100-plus page reports on its finances, including an operating budget, performance measurement report, and comprehensive annual financial report.

But few of the city's 18,000 residents read these statements, and knowledge of Saco's finances is limited despite the rivers of ink devoted to them, said finance director **Lisa Parker**, a member of AGA's Maine Chapter.

"Realistically, the average citizen is not going to read hundreds and hundreds of pages of reports," Parker said.

To make the financial information more accessible, the town helped develop one of the first prototypes of a four-page <u>"citizen-centric" report</u> that summarizes the information in all three financial reports and directs residents to the town's <u>website</u>, where they can "drill down and learn more about the stuff they're interested in," Parker said. <u>Read the entire article.</u> -- Andrew Ackerman, *The Bond Buyer*.

EDUCATION + **EXAMPLE** = **CONTINUE** National Headquarters to Offer CGFM Application Fee Rebate This Fall

AGA National Headquarters is going to offer again this year the "\$20 rebate" promotion for the CGFM \$85 application fee during **September 1, 07 through November 30, 2007**. Chapters also get "50 chapter points" for each application during this period, and if a chapter has the most applications during this period the chapter also gets a \$20 award for each application.

GAO Issues Final 2007 Revision to Government Auditing Standards

On July 27, the Government Accountability Office released *Government Auditing Standards, July 2007 Revision*. In Jan., the GAO announced the issuance of a revision to the "Yellow Book," but at that time it indicated the revision would not be complete until final changes were made to chapter 3 regarding quality control and assurance.

The quality control and peer review section of chapter 3 had been re-exposed by the GAO based on comments they received from the due process review of the original draft revisions. The issuance of the July 2007 Yellow Book now completes the revision to the standards, including the sections on quality control and peer review and a number of technical changes to the Jan. revision. Ctrl+Shift+! formats as 12,345.00 (number format) Ctrl+Shift+\$ formats as \$12,345.00 (currency format) Ctrl+Shift+% formats as 1234500% (percentage format) Ctrl+Shift+^ formats as 1.23E+04 (scientific format)
