"Godfather" of NM Tax Reform to Teach Government Accountants a Thing or Two!

Santa Fe- Known as the "Godfather" of Major Tax Reform in New Mexico, State Senator Bill Sharer (R-Farmington) will be a speaker at the

AGA 2018 Professional Development Training seminar on Friday, April 6, 2018. The training and seminar are sponsored by the New Mexico Chapter and the Albuquerque Association of Government Accountants (AGA) and are being held at the Hilton Buffalo Thunder in Santa Fe.

Senator Sharer will speak to the government accounts on "Tax Reform: How in the world did we get to this !%o*\$#?!! tax system?"

Senator Sharer will also give a brief history of taxation in New Mexico from Territorial times through today. He will discuss what worked, what didn't/doesn't and what should we do and what can we do to improve the tax system in the state for the benefit of everyone.

Senator sharer will tell the accountants that New Mexico needs a tax system that is:

- Simple enough for the average citizen to understand;
- Raises enough revenue to meet the obligations of the state;
- · AND attracts new industries (that we want) to our Great State!

Senator Sharer will speak to the government accountants about the vital need for tax reform in New Mexico and how reform can affect the way they perform their roles in government and in the private sector. His class and discussion will be held on Friday, April 6 at 11:10 a.m. in the Tewa 1-3 ballroom.

Senator Sharer believes eliminating the hundreds of tax deductions, exemptions and tax credits and implementing a simple, low consumption tax will make the government accounts and their clients' lives easier while being more fair to everyone.

Other topics of the 2018 AGA Professional Development Training include: Criminal Fraud Investigation; Best Practices for those in Charge of Governance and Top Management; Identifying Hidden Risks, Hidden Exposure: The future of accounting in the digital age. The title of this year's AGA training is "Seeing Through the Transparency in Government." AGA is the member organization for government financial management professionals.
