Hello Ozarks Chapter and welcome to a new fiscal year!

This year our chapter is focusing on the following objectives:

- Educational Meetings:




Did you know?

The education co-chair serves as the education committee chair and coordinates high quality educational events for chapter members and other government financial management professionals.


The Education - Co-Chair duties include:

Description:

Review and monitor the collection of the 1/4-cent Capital Improvements Sales Tax revenues, the 1/8-cent Transportation Sales Tax revenues, the 3/4-cent Police and Fire Fighters Pension Fund Sales Tax revenues, the Hotel/Motel Tax revenues, and the Level Property Tax revenues. In addition the committee may evaluate any proposed reduction or enhancement to pension benefits before presentation to City Council.

Requirements:

- 1. Must be a resident of Springfield, MO for at least three (3) years.
- 2. Meetings take place at 5:30 pm on the 3rd Tuesday of February, May, August, and November.

There are currently multiple chairs available for the Citizens Tax Oversight Committee in Springfield, MO.


Excel Tips & Tricks

We can all use some tips and tricks to Excel. Introducing:

SLICERS

Slicers are another way to Filter Data.


1. Highlight your data set and make sure to include the column headers.



2. Choose Insert from the File menu and select Table.



3. Make sure the check box is checked on My table has headers.




4. In the Table Design, select Insert Slicers.



5. A box will pop up that will allow you to select the Slicers or column headers.



6. Slicer will then create menus for each column you select and you can filter from those menus. Use the control key to select multiple values.
