

ABOUT THE PAUL VIDUNAS MEMORIAL FUND



The Paul Vidunas Memorial Fund was established in 1998 shortly after the death of then Trenton Chapter President Paul Vidunas. During his lifetime, Paul was as an enthusiastic volunteer for various community based organizations. The establishment of a fund that would support a variety of community service groups seemed a fitting tribute to this memory.

Each year, a different recipient is selected to receive funds collected throughout the program year. The local area charity for this year's Paul Vidunas Fund is Signal 22 Canteen.

Signal 22 Canteen's mission is to respond to any man-made or natural disaster, and to provide proper nourishment for police officers, fire fighters, EMS, and any other agency personnel assigned to any disaster. In furtherance of this mission, the organization also provides sustenance to the victims of disaster.

Signal 22 Canteen responds to such disasters within a 30 mile radius of Trenton, New Jersey, and when called upon, to events outside of the 30 mile radius. The area currently covered has a population of over 1.2 million residents, which can grow to over 1.5 million people during a normal work day. The organization provides assorted beverages, cold lunchmeat, hot sandwiches, and hot platters to those assisting during a disaster.

Signal 22 Canteen is a non-denominational, independent organization, and all services are open to everyone needing assistance. For information about the organization: http://signal22canteen.blogspot.com/

CGFM Intensive Review Course & Exams

AGA's Intensive Review Course (IRC) with CGFM examinations *included* is a great opportunity to review the course material with a knowledgeable instructor and complete your CGFM!

The next IRC, offering up to 18 CPEs, will be held in Alexandria, Virginia, October 8-9, 2018. The class will run 8 a.m. – 5 p.m. both days. The cost of the course for qualified participants is as follows:

- \$375 for AGA members
- \$425 for nonmembers

The CGFM examinations are offered at no additional cost to course attendees — a \$375 savings!

The CGFM examinations can be taken by appointment only at <u>Pearson Professional Testing Centers</u> from October 10, 2018 – January 31, 2019, using vouchers provided by AGA.

- What is the IRC? It is a special, limited enrollment opportunity for individuals who have already been studying for the CGFM examinations and want extra reinforcement of the material. It is a review of the main topics covered on the CGFM examinations, led by a knowledgeable instructor.
- The IRC is not a shortcut. It is not a prep course with strategies on how to pass the exams, and it is not a substitute for the three AGA instructor-led training courses. The IRC is usually not enough, by itself, to prepare for the CGFM examinations — advance preparation is strongly recommended.

To participate in this event, individuals must:

- 1. First apply and be accepted into the CGFM program (see CGFM process for more information).
- 2. Pre-register for the IRC.
