Given the pandemic limitations on gathering in person, as has been our tradition from the past, our chapter pivoted to the online virtual platform without missing a beat.

The 2021 Chapter Awards Ceremony was held on Wednesday June 9th, 2021. Mat Wenzel, Chapter President 2020-2021, opened the Ceremony with an expression of thanks to our sponsors, without whose support, our important work in advancing government accountability could not go on. Be a CEAR Reviewer!

All-Star panel presents the merits and successes of CEAR reivew

MPG AGA's Education Committee hosted its first training event of the program year on September 14, featuring a robust discussion on the Certificate of Excellence in Accountability Reporting (CEAR) program for federal government agencies. Reviewers in the program provide recommendations for individual agency PARs/AFRs, recognize critical agency efforts, and trains agency participants to disseminate knowledge to other financial management peers.

The panel consisted of seasoned CEAR reviewers and experts in the federal accounting field. They shared some of their own tips in reviewing as well as some best practices from recognized agencies. It was an enlightening discussion and received very positive recipient feedback. Participants received 1.5 CPE thanks to the chapter's ongoing education efforts. Recent Accounting & Reporting Updates

A snapshot of federal, state, and local changes.

Government Accounting Standards Board

In July 2021, GASB issued a proposed Concepts Statement that describes the Board's proposed focus on state and local government note disclosure requirements. *See gasb.org for the revised exposure draft and additional details.*

Earlier in 2021, GASB released a fact sheet discussing its June 2020 exposure draft on the financial reporting model. GASB has sought to revise governmental fund financial statement standards to have a short-term financial resources and accrual accounting focus._*See gasb.org for the fact sheet and additional details.*

Federal Accounting Standards Advisory Board

In July 2021, FASAB issued Statement of Federal Financial Accounting Standards (SFFAS) 59, *Accounting and Reporting of Government Land*. This standard amends several existing standards and prescribes additional accounting and disclosure requirements for land and related activity, and further clarifies requirements for stewardship land. SFFAS 49 is effective for reporting periods beginning after September 30, 2021, though including a four year transisition period for the information to be reported as basic information. *See fasab.org for SFFAS 49 and additional details.*
