Toys for Tots—Marine Toys for Tots Foundation

Major William L Hendricks founded Toys for Tots in 1947 and the United States Marine Corps Reserve has been carrying out this tradition ever since. What started in the City of Los Angeles has become one of the nations most recognized and hardworking foundations.

The mission of the U.S. Marine Corps Reserve Toys for Tots program is to collect new, unwrapped toys during October, November and December each year, and distribute those toys as Christmas gifts to less fortunate children in the community in which the campaign is conducted.

In the month of December, please donate toys, books, or games to Toys for Tots at your local Toys for Tots drop-off location—these are located outside of many of your major retailers, such as Wal-Mart. This is a little different than in the past where we have requested you bring toy to the Holiday Social, but hopefully this will be more convenient for everyone!

Did you know that Toys for Tots is a top rated charity? 97% of your donation goes to the mission of providing toys, books, and other gifts to less fortunate children. The 3% spend on support principally covers fundraising expenses—not one dollar donated goes to pay for salaries or any other manpower costs.

Secretary-Brandi Aldridge:

The minutes of the September 26, 2013 CEC meeting, presented by email, were passed.

Treasurer-Greg Drake:

Greg presented the financial report; Bob made a motion to pass, John seconded and the motion passed.

Education-John Everest:

The November member meeting was held at Spring Net Underground on November 14 but was poorly attended. The holiday luncheon will be held at Jim's Steakhouse on December 19 from 12-2pm. There will be a "white elephant" gift exchange for members. The next member meeting will be held January 16 at Rare Breed.

Communication-Brandie Fisher:


