

Join the NOVAGA Chapter for its monthly meeting on March 22nd from 6pm to 8:30pm. This meeting will feature Andrea Sampanis, Grants Quality Service Management Office (QSMO) Lead at the Department of Health and Human Services (DHHS). Ms. Sampanis will speak on how the Grants QSMO mission offers federal awarding agencies shared information technology (IT) solutions and services that empower agencies and grant recipients to deliver efficiently and effectively on the agency's \$1T annual grants mission.

The Office of Management and Budget (OMB) created QSMOs in OMB Memo M-19-16 (April 2019) to improve agency mission delivery though the use of efficient, effective, and modern federal shared services. OMB designated DHHS as the Grants QSMO in January 2021. In her role at the Grants QSMO Lead, Ms. Sampanis works across government improving the way agencies buy services and share systems. Ms. Sampanis earned her MPA from George Washington University and her BA from Providence College. She is a Certified Government Financial Manager (CGFM), is SAP ERP certified, and has her COR Level II certification.


Tip #1

If you achieve this manageable goal, you will be positioned to meet the continuing professional education requirements, if applicable. Please note that there is a limit to 20 hours in taxation per cycle and 4 hours must be in ethics.

Tip #2

If you decide to take an instructor led CGFM Training, ask questions related to the material. This will make the learning more engaging and help others too.

Here's how it works:

- 1. **Take** one of your CGFM examinations between March 1 and April 30, 2023.
- Request a voucher code for your next CGFM examination by emailing agacgfm@agacgfm.org as soon as you take your exam, and no later than May 7, 2023.
- 3. Receive one exam voucher code via email.
- 4. **Schedule and take** your next CGFM exam using the voucher code as payment by **by July 31, 2023.**

Terms and conditions:

- Taking a CGFM exam <u>prior</u> to March 1, 2023 will <u>not</u> qualify for this promotion.
- We recommend requesting your voucher code as soon as you take the exam during the March-April 2023 timeframe.
- Voucher codes will only be issued to current CGFM candidates who took a CGFM examination between March 1 and April 30, 2023, and who still have to pass at least one CGFM examination. Voucher codes will only be distributed to those who request them.
- Voucher codes will be distributed on specific dates only: 3/15, 3/31, 4/17, 5/1 and 5/12. Vouchers will be sent to individuals who have met the above requirements and request the voucher at least three days prior to the distribution date.
- Each candidate may only receive one voucher code and they are non-transferable.
- All voucher codes will expire on July 31, 2023 and will <u>not</u> be extended for any reason.
 Testing appointments may fill up candidates are encouraged to request their voucher code and schedule their appointment as soon as possible.

By virtue of the authority vested by the Constitution of Virginia in the Governor of the Commonwealth of Virginia, there is hereby officially recognized:

Certified Government Financial Manager Month

WHEREAS, the Association of Government Accountants has a network of more than 14,000 members in 96 chapters in the United States and around the world representing senior executives, mid-level managers, entry-level employees, elected officials, professors, and students; and

WHEREAS, the Richmond Chapter of the Association of Government Accountants (AGA), established in 1974, has approximately 300 active members representing state, federal, municipal, and private sector accountants, auditors, and financial managers in Virginia; and

WHEREAS, the AGA Richmond Chapter members uphold the standards established in the Code of Ethics and respond to the AGA's mission of advancing accountability, transparency, and leadership by promoting education, certification, innovation, and collaboration across all levels of government and to stakeholders in service to citizens of the Commonwealth of Virginia; and

WHEREAS, Certified Government Financial Manager Month promotes opportunity and ethics in financial management throughout government, advances government accountability through the CGFM program, and celebrates the hard-working men and women who demonstrate dependability, initiative, and practical stewardship of states resources;
