Chapter News

April's Secretary Report

The April meeting of the East TN AGA Chapter was held on April 12, 2022, at Calhoun's on the River. President Travis Lowe opened the meeting and invited those in attendance to the lunch buffet. Mr. Lowe then introduced our speaker, Mark Burnette with LBMC Advisory Services.

Mr. Burnette began by discussing why cybersecurity is so challenging and why programs fail. To be successful, cybersecurity programs need proper staffing, security policies, risk assessments, required passwords, and proper monitoring. Many companies fail at cybersecurity because they are more focused on compliance with laws and regulations that govern cybersecurity than they are with risk management. Mr. Burnette then discussed an action plan for companies to follow to manage cybersecurity risks. Lastly, Mr. Burnette discussed how we can be safe at home. We should be vigilant and always expect to be a target. We should use different passwords for each online account we have, we should use two-factor password authentication, and we should not provide any personal information to online sites or through email.

President Lowe closed by thanking Mr. Burnette for his very informative presentation.
