Message from the President

I have prepared an Excel Spreadsheet to comparing the By-Law of HGA/HQ and our Chapter in an attempt to highlight these differences and to help me, the Board and Committees accomplish this task before the end of this Program Year. Goals for 2022-2023 and Beyond

• Membership & Education:

• Accountability:

- Submit chapter's CCR to AGA's Certificate of Excellence Review Program.

• CGFM Goals:
