President's Message



Our 2018/2019 program year is off to a great start!

At our September and October luncheons, we had two distinguished speakers from the Federal CFO community:

- Gerard Badorrek CFO of GSA Mr. Badorrek opened our luncheon series in September by sharing his experiences as GSA's CFO and how he best leveraged private sector best practices to transform government; and
- Jeff DeWit CFO of NASA Mr. DeWit gave an engaging presentation to our members titled: "It's Not Rocket Science, It's Rocket Accounting."

So, don't missed our December luncheon scheduled at the Hamilton on December 12, 2018!

Also in September our Early Careers Committee, in coordination with the Northern Virginia and Montgomery/PG Chapters, offered our annual picnic at Haines Point and we completed our 2018 Citizen Centric Report (CCR) outlining our Chapter's accomplishments during the program year 2017/2018.

Below are some of our key accomplishments outlined in the CCR:

- Our professional development program won the 2018 Chapter Education Award as a result of conferring more than 4,700 Continuing Professional Education Credits to more than 2,000 professionals across monthly luncheons, audio conferences and live trainings.
- The CGFM Committee, continued to promote the value of certification, leading an awareness campaign and implementing a scholarship program where the Chapter reimbursed member exam fees for those that successfully passed the CGFM exam, enabling the support of 17 new recipients of the CGFM.
- The Chapter membership as of September 27, 2018 was 1,880, including over 180 new members, and realizing a continued focus on increasing member value throughout the fiscal year.
- Through our community services efforts, our Chapter raised \$2,644 in monetary donations to support the community, achieved 119 volunteer hours; collected 30 pounds of food, 30 school/art craft supplies; and 25 toys. Recipients include nonprofit organizations such as DC Child and Family Services; Junior Achievement; Miriam's Kitchen; The Leukemia & Lymphoma Society; A Wider Circle; Capital Area Food Bank; St. Jude's Children's Research Hospital; and Toys for Tots.

I will like to encourage to all our members to download our CCR report to get additional details on what our Chapter is doing to accomplish our mission. Finally, I would like to thank all our committee members for their continued efforts and commitment to our Chapter, as well as, I want to thank our Corporate Sponsors for enabling the DC Chapter to provide the Chapter's many educational and other member services.

Look Ahead: Get to Know December Luncheon Speaker - Tim Soltis



Tim Soltis is the new Deputy Controller in Office of Federal Financial Management (OFFM). Tim came from the Department of Education (Education) where he served as acting Chief Financial Officer (CFO) and Chief Acquisition Officer from May 2016 to January 2018 and as Deputy CFO from March 2013 to June 2018. In those roles, Tim led multiple financial and acquisition management programs and activities for the Department of Education, to include accounting for a loan portfolio of over \$1.2 trillion in assets and almost \$70 billion in budget authority.

He also oversaw Education's production of the Agency Financial Reports (AFR), IT investments in business systems, indirect cost rate negotiations, contracting activities, audit resolution, and the internal control programs. Tim played a key role supporting Administration management priorities, including Cross Agency Priority goals related to grants, shared services, and improper payments.

Before joining Education, Tim held various senior leadership and audit positions in the Department of Defense, including assignments in Korea and Germany, and in the Intelligence Community where he gained extensive experience leading day-to-day operations of large and complex mission support functions and driving large-scale change initiatives to improve the efficiency and effectiveness of operations. He has extensive experience advising senior agency leadership on matters related to strategic planning, budget, accounting, preparing financial reports, streamlining mission support functions, managing performance, implementing new business systems, implementing internal controls, and managing risks.

A Cleveland, Ohio native, Tim earned his Bachelor of Science degree in accounting from Case Western Reserve University, and he has completed executive leadership programs at Harvard and the Federal Executive Institute. He is a Certified Public Accountant (CPA) and Certified Information Systems Auditor (CISA).

Inside The Black Box

Changes in the Statement of Changes in Net Position

Background

The Statement of Changes in Net Position (SCNP) got a significant makeover for FY2019, though it's mostly cosmetic.

Formats

The most significant change is that Unexpended Appropriations is now in the first section and Cumulative Results of Operations is now in the second. None of the lines within each section changed, so the FY2019 Unexpended Appropriations lines are the equivalent FY2018 lines minus 17 (e.g., FY2018 line 18 is FY2019 line 1) and FY2019 Cumulative Results of Operations lines are the equivalent FY2018 lines plus 9 (e.g., FY2018 line 1 is FY2019 line 10).

New Continuing Resolution Account

This year, the U.S. Standard General Ledger (USSGL) Board added a new equity account, 309000 Unexpended Appropriations while Awaiting a Warrant, to counterbalance the 109000 cash account added in FY2006. This new account is included together with 310100 Unexpended Appropriations - Appropriations Received on Line 4 Appropriations received. Because of this, equity account 310100 will only be associated with cash account 101000 in the future.

Custodial Offsets

Account 599300 Offset to Non-Entity Collections - Statement of Changes in Net Position now is reported on two lines. The original Line 22 Other is still used for entries where the Budgetary Impact Indicator is E (has impact), but cases where there is no impact (Indicator is D) now report 599300's balance on Line 13 Other Adjustments.

Account 599700 Financing Sources Transferred in from Custodial Statement Collections was moved from new Line 17 (FY2018 Line 8) Transfers-in/out without reimbursement to Line 15 Nonexchange revenue. However, if 599700 is associated with exchange revenue, then it is reported on the Statement of Net Cost.

New Accounts

The new SGL account 571300 Accrual of Amounts Receivable from Custodian or Non-Entity Assets Receivable from a Federal Agency - Other than the General Fund of the U.S. Government is also reported on Line 15 Nonexchange revenue, or if associated with exchange revenue, on the Statement of Net Cost.

New SGL accounts 573500/573600 Appropriated Dedicated Collections to be Transferred in/out are reported on Line 17 Transfers-in/out without reimbursement.

Conclusion

After this year's statements have been put to bed, make certain you revise your SCNP format for next year. If you do plan to use accounts 571300 or 599700 next year, also check that you distinguish between offsets of exchange or nonexchange revenue. You may need to add subaccounts to capture this distinction in your system.


