Certified Government Financial Manager[®] (CGFM[®]) is a professional certification recognizing the unique skills and special knowledge required of today's government financial managers. It covers governmental accounting, auditing, financial reporting, internal controls and budgeting at the federal, state and local levels.

The CGFM certification can help you to:

- Increase and showcase your knowledge
- Distinguish yourself
- Enhance your marketability

To earn the CGFM, individuals must apply for the CGFM program and meet the following requirements:

Ethics — read and agree to abide by AGA's Code of Ethics

Education — have a bachelor's degree from an accredited college or university

Examinations — pass three comprehensive CGFM examinations

Experience — have at least two years of professional-level experience in government financial management

Technical Updates Corner-FASAB and GASB

Federal Accounting Standards Advisory Board (FASAB)

October 27, 2017—FASAB issued SFFAS 53, Budget and Accrual Reconciliation

This Statement amends requirements for a reconciliation between budgetary and financial accounting information established by Statement of Federal Financial Accounting Standards (SFFAS) 7, Accounting for Revenue and Other Financing Sources and Concepts for Reconciling Budgetary and Financial Accounting.

To increase informational value and usefulness, and to support the government-wide financial statement reconciling net operating cost to the budget deficit, **this Statement provides for the budget and accrual reconciliation (BAR) to replace the statement of financing** for financial statements issued after September 30, 2018.

The BAR explains the relationship between the entity's net outlays on a budgetary basis and the net cost of operations during the reporting period. The BAR will start with net cost of operations and be adjusted by :

- components of net cost that are not part of net outlays,
- components of net outlays that are not part of net cost, and
- other temporary timing differences, which reflect some special adjustments.

Governmental Accounting Standards Board (GASB)

OMB Releases Bulletin 17-03—Audit Requirements for Federal Financial Statements

September 29, 2017—

This Bulletin, which includes an attachment and Appendices A-H, establishes the minimum requirements for audits of Federal financial statements and applies to audits of the financial statements of executive departments, agencies, and Government corporations (Appendices A, C, and D) and certain components of these agencies (Appendix B).

OMB Bulletin 17-03 reflects recent changes in U.S. Auditing Standards -AICPA (Clarified), identified as AU-C; recent changes in the AICPA's clarified attestation standards, identified as AT-C; and the 2011 revision of Government Auditing Standards (Yellow Book). This Bulletin also clarifies the auditor's responsibilities regarding compliance with provisions of applicable laws, regulations, contracts, and grant agreements and other requirements related to the audit of the consolidated financial statements of the U.S. government.

Rescissions: The provisions of this Bulletin supersede the provisions in OMB Bulletin *15-02,Audit Requirements* for Federal Financial Statements.

Effective Date: The provisions of this Bulletin are effective immediately for audits of financial statements, unless stipulated otherwise.
