

AGA is the premier association for advancing government accountability. AGA defines government accountability as a government's obligation to the people for its actions and use of resources



MEMBERSHIP

Our membership is comprised of individuals employed at state, local and federal governments, the private sector, as well as retired and academic, student and other members. 




CHAPTER FINANCIALS

The Chapter generated \$6.3 thousand in revenue and \$7.5 thousand of expenses during the 2023-2024 program year, netting a shortfall of \$1.1 thousand. Revenues and expenses were primarily related to registration fees from monthly CPE events and the related costs of the events.


Revenues \$6.3k

Revenues totaled \$6,326 during the program year and were generated from registration fees from monthly CPE events (\$5,432), AGA dues (\$309) and other revenues including overpayments of bank charges, and allotments from AGA National for conference dues (\$585).



Expenses \$7.5k

Expenses totaled \$7,460 during the program year and were related to costs of monthly CPE events (\$5,721), AGA conference dues (\$542), website renewal fees (\$490), CPE renewal fees (\$400) and for the purchase gift cards raffled at the monthly CPE events (\$307).
