

Speaker: Dr. James Wooster

Office of the Chief Economist/Office of Revenue and Economic Analysis.

The Chief Economist is the chief advisor on economic matters to the Treasurer and also supports other State agencies. The OCE/OREA provides data, projections, and analyses for the Governor's Budget Message, Budget in Brief, Citizen's Tax Guide, the Comprehensive Annual Financial Report, the Appropriations Act, the Annual Tax Expenditure Report, the Statistics of Income Report, the Official Financial Statement, and numerous Fiscal Notes for the State Legislature.

Dr. James H. Wooster joined the Department of the Treasury as Chief Economist in February of 2015.

Dr. Wooster, who has 28 years of experience in domestic and international public finance, previously served with the U.S. Department of the Treasury as a tax advisor to various foreign governments. He is also a former Chief Economist for the Commonwealth of Massachusetts.

He brings special expertise and experience in developing analytical models and other tools that will enhance Treasury's economic and revenue analysis, providing a stronger foundation for the State's policy development and implementation.

From 1991-92, Dr. Wooster was the Chief Economist for the Massachusetts Department of Revenue, where he was responsible for improving the accuracy of forecasts and policy analysis. He developed a tax analysis and research unit to forecast Massachusetts tax collections and scrutinize the revenue impact of proposed tax legislation. He also published articles on tax reform, and served the Commonwealth as Chief of the Bureau of Analysis Estimation and Research from 1989 to 1991.

In 1993, Dr. Wooster joined the U.S. Department of the Treasury as resident tax policy advisor to the government of Bulgaria. He also has served as a long-term resident advisor in Kazakhstan, Kosovo, Bosnia and Herzegovina and Azerbaijan. He participated in short-term missions in Colombia, Sudan, Ukraine, Romania, Afghanistan, Jamaica, Honduras and Tunisia.

Dr. Wooster earned his Ph.D. in economics from the University of Massachusetts at Amherst.

FISMA Introduction @ NJDOL | March 9 | 2-3:50 p.m. ET | 2 CPEs

The <u>Federal Information Security Modernization Act of 2014 (FISMA)</u> affects how agencies implement information security policies for administrative and mission-support teams, according to the <u>Department of Homeland Security (DHS)</u>.

FISMA 2014 codifies DHS's role in administering the implementation of information security policies for federal executive branch civilian agencies, overseeing agencies' compliance with those policies, and assisting the U.S. Office of Management and Budget (OMB) in developing the policies. The legislation also allows DHS to develop and oversee the implementation of binding operational directives to other agencies, in accordance with OMB policies and practices.

At the end of the first year the Program's Committee will evaluate the scholarship recipient's performance based on the criteria specified above, and, if satisfied, this member may be awarded one more year of the sponsorship for full membership (Dues-National and Trenton Chapter-only).

The application for the Program will be placed on AGA-Trenton website shortly. The scholarship recipient will be announced and introduced at AGA-Trenton's annual Award Dinner on May 18, 2016.
