February Meeting Minutes

Our February meeting of the East TN AGA Chapter was held virtually on February 9, 2021. President Astra Cope opened the meeting and introduced the speaker, John Sutton with County Technical Assistance Service (CTAS) speaking on the Certified County Finance Officer (CCFO) program.

John provided some general information about the program which started in 2018. This program was developed by CTAS in conjunction with the Tennessee Comptroller's office. The program consists of eleven classes that cover such topics as financial reporting, purchasing and payroll, to name a few. John explained that most of the classes are being held virtually right now, but hopes that more in-person classes will be on the horizon.

As John explained, the courses follow CPE standards of AICPA & NASBA and are designed from basic to intermediate skill level of experience. CCFOs must complete 16 hours of CPE annually to maintain their certification. Anyone interested in enrolling in the program must first apply with the Tennessee Comptroller's office. Astra thanked John for his presentation and for everyone attending. Astra reminded everyone of our next meeting on March 9, and also asked all members to watch for an e-mail regarding the Chapter's new by-laws.
