### **NCC Representative Corner**



Dallas Chapter Members,

Thank you again for the opportunity to serve as the representative for the Dallas chapter for the AGA's National Council of Chapters (NCC) and as the Chapter Director for

Area 3 on AGA's National Governing Board (NGB).

In previous newsletters, I described how the AGA made updates the Chapter Recognition Program to include new/revised key performance/health indicators within chapter reports. The goal of the updated program was to remove the administrative burden of reporting on items that are not indicators of health and focus on managing the business of our chapter. The new program, named "Achievements in Chapter Excellence (ACE)" was implemented for the 2020-2021 program year. ACE consists of two parts one is a checklist of compliance items to be completed annually, while the other part is what chapters are evaluated on for their annual award. The evaluation part allows chapters to measure against how they achieve their goals for the year using three Tiers, each corresponding with a level by which the chapter met or exceeded its goals. The chapter receives points for each Tier, with Tiers corresponding to the chapter exceeding its goals having additional point value.

In recognition of our chapter's key accomplishments in pursuit of our 2020-2021 strategic goals, the Dallas Chapter received the Platinum recognition (the highest designation). The purpose of the Bronze, Silver, Gold and Platinum designations is to encourage chapters to participate in ACE at the level they feel comfortable with and to develop continuity of sound leadership and programs.

As we continue our efforts in the 2021-2022 program year, especially given the continued COVID-19 environment and the limitations that has placed on all of our members, I look forward to updating you on the chapter's key

accomplishments in support of our 2021-2022 strategic goals.

In regard to our goals related to Education, we held our Fall virtual event on October 13, 2021. This event offered four hours towards our goal of providing 14 continuing professional education credits. We were pleased to have speakers from Eide Bailly LLP and Kearney & Company. We also were excited to host a virtual Bingo Night. We were also able to virtually socialize and two lucky participants won the Bingo games and received gift card awards.

Throughout 2021-2022 program year, we will continue to collaborate with the Oklahoma City and Ozarks chapters, and benefit from the guidance and lessons learned from other chapters (such as best practices employed by the Shenandoah Valley, Virginia Peninsula and Richmond Chapters that help us plan our virtual CPE and social events).

On behalf of the Dallas AGA CEC, I want to thank all of our members and your continued support of the chapter. Enjoy the holiday season and we look forward to 2022.
