Technical Updates Corner—FASAB and GASB

Federal Accounting Standards Advisory Board (FASAB)

August 22, 2018—Clarification of Federal Lease Standards

On April 17, 2018, the Federal Accounting Standards Advisory Board (FASAB) issued Statement of Federal Financial Accounting Standards (SFFAS) 54 titled Leases: An Amendment of SFFAS 5, Accounting for Liabilities of the Federal Government, and SFFAS 6, Accounting for Property, Plant, and Equipment. SFFAS 54 revises the financial reporting standards for federal lease accounting. The Statement provides a comprehensive set of lease accounting standards to recognize federal lease activities in the reporting entity's general purpose federal financial reports and includes appropriate disclosures.

The requirements of SFFAS 54 are effective for reporting periods beginning after September 30, 2020—fiscal year (FY) 2021. Early adoption of SFFAS 54 is not permitted.

Office of Management and Budget (OMB)

July 30, 2018—Circular A-136, Revised

The Office of Management and Budget (OMB), with input from the financial management community, has updated OMB Circular A-136, Financial Reporting Requirements. This update streamlines reporting requirements and reflects current Federal generally accepted accounting principles.

Each Executive Branch entity that is required to prepare audited financial statements under the CFO Act, GMRA, or the ATDA must comply with Sections I, II, and IV of this Circular. In addition, each Executive Branch entity that prepares a Summary of Performance and Financial Information must comply with Section III. Also, all CFO Act agencies and ATDA agencies listed in Appendix A must comply with Section V.

Governmental Accounting Standards Board (GASB)

Norwalk, CT—August 6, 2018—GASB Proposes Improvements to Reporting of Conduit Debt Obligations

To provide financing for specific governmental or nongovernmental third-party obligors, some governments issue conduit debt obligations bearing the government's own name. Debt service payments generally are made by third-party obligors directly to debt trustees or, in private placements, directly to debt holders. In many cases, the issuer assumes no responsibility for debt service payments of a conduit debt obligation beyond the resources provided by the third-party obligor.

The objective of this Statement is to better meet the information needs of financial statement users by enhancing the comparability and consistency of conduit debt obligation reporting and reporting of related transactions and other events by state and local government issuers. This Statement also is intended to improve the relevance, reliability, and usefulness of information about conduit debt obligations, as well as related transactions and other events. This proposed Statement would require issuers to disclose general information about their conduit debt obligations, organized by type of commitment(s), including the aggregate outstanding principal amount of the issuers' conduit debt obligations and a description of each type of commitment(s). Issuers that recognize liabilities related to conduit debt obligations also would disclose information about the amount recognized and how the liabilities change during the reporting period.
