Our October meeting of the 2018-2019 year was held on October 9, 2018 at Calhoun's on the River. The meeting was opened by Alicia Reed, President with a welcome to everyone. Alicia introduced the speaker, Michael Fitzgerald, Associate General Counsel for the University of Tennessee.

Our guest speaker, Michael Fitzgerald, presented a program on How to Avoid Employment Litigation. Michael presented several interesting facts on employment litigation. To name a few - 33% of Federal court cases are employment litigation; half of those cases are retaliation; the next three are race, sex and disability. Michael's presentation focused on hiring and firing tips. The hiring tips -1) Hire as a team; 2) Document the decision; and 3) Know your finalist. The firing tips -1) Communicate problems; 2) Eliminate grounds for lawsuits; and 3) Have a process. He gave us valuable information on how to avoid employment litigation and protect our companies/entities.

Alicia closed the meeting by thanking Michael for his presentation and reminding everyone of our two day training event at the UT Conference Center on November 14th and 15th. A brief board meeting was held to finalize the details for the training event.
