Merry Christmas and Happy Holidays to you and your families! The start of 2020 is coming fast. Is earning the CGFM certification on your list of New Year's resolutions?


Here are some things you need to know:

- The CGFM certification is 100% focused on government financial management with a broad coverage of various aspects of financial management at the federal, state and local levels.
- · The CGFM certification benefits you as an employee by increasing your knowledge of government financial management.
- The CGFM certification benefits your employer as you have a better understanding of how the different government financial management components fit together.
- · The initial CGFM requirements are:
  - Ethics Read and agree to abide by AGA's Code of Ethics.
  - Education Have a Bachelors' degree from an accredited U.S. college or university.
  - Examinations Pass all 3 comprehensive CGFM examinations
  - Experience Complete at least 2 years of professional-level experience in the U.S. government financial management field (exams may be scheduled and taken before the two years have been completed)
- · Your Ozarks Chapter is here to help! Study guides for each of the exams can be checked out at no cost, and the Chapter offers CPE to help meet your requirements of 80 CPE hours every two years.
- · If your employer did not pay for your exams, an Ozarks Chapter scholarship is available for the cost of the program application and exam fees after passing all 3 exams.


