Through working with Rare Breed, hundreds of youth have set goals, achieved stability, completed education, become employed and moved forward in their lives.

This is a repeat Community Service project for AGA. In September 2013 AGA collected toiletries and spare pocket change for the center. In January AGA will again collect pocket change and gently worn winter apparel. Please check your closets for <u>Jackets, Coats, Shoes, Gloves and</u> <u>Hats</u> that can be donated to the youths. 


