CGFM

WHAT IS CGFM?

Certified Government Financial Manager® (CGFM®) is a professional certification recognizing the unique skills and special knowledge required of today's government financial managers. It covers governmental accounting, auditing, financial reporting, internal controls and budgeting at the federal, state and local levels.

To earn the CGFM, individuals must apply for the CGFM program and meet the following requirements:

<u>Ethics</u> — read and agree to abide by AGA's Code of Ethics <u>Education</u> — have a bachelor's degree from an accredited college or university

Examinations — pass three comprehensive CGFM examinations

Experience — have at least two years of professional-level experience in government financial management

Not yet a CGFM?

CGFM Examination: Applicants must take and pass three comprehensive examinations to become a CGFM:

- Course 1: Governmental Environment
- Course 2: Governmental Accounting, Financial Reporting and Budgeting
- Course 3: Governmental Financial Management and Control

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Technical Updates Corner

Federal Accounting Standards Advisory Board (FASAB)

FASAB Issues Statement of Federal Financial Accounting Standards 49, Public-Private Partnerships: Disclosure Requirements

SFFAS 49 establishes principles to ensure that disclosures about public-private partnerships (P3s) are presented in the reporting entity's general purpose federal financial reports. The principles establish a P3 definition and identify risk-based characteristics that need to exist before considering the P3 arrangement or transaction for disclosure.

If these characteristics and other criteria are met, the Statement requires the disclosure of quantitative and qualitative information. The information will assist users in understanding the nature of P3s, such as the relative benefits/revenues received in exchange for the government's consideration, the contractual terms governing payments to and from the government, and related risks to the government including those deemed remote.

Agencies can provide disclosures by individual P3 or summarized - for example, by an entity's strategic objectives, departmental or bureau categorizations, or program budget classifications.

Governmental Accounting Standards Board (GASB)

GASB ISSUES PENSION GUIDANCE ADDRESSING ISSUES RAISED BY STAKEHOLDERS DURING IMPLEMENTATION

April 11, 2016—GASB Statement No. 82, Pension Issues, addresses:

- Presentation of payroll-related measures in required supplementary information
- Selection of assumptions and the treatment of deviations from guidance in Actuarial Standards of Practice for financial reporting purposes, and
- Classification of payments made by employers to satisfy plan member contribution requirements.

The Statement is designed to improve consistency in the application of the pension standards by clarifying or amending related areas of existing guidance. Specifically, the practice issues raised by stakeholders during implementation relate to the following Statements: No. 67, Financial Reporting for Pension Plans, No. 68, Accounting and Financial Reporting for Pensions, and No. 73, Accounting and Financial Reporting for Pensions and Related Assets That Are Not within the Scope of GASB Statement 68.

The requirements of GASB Statement 82 are generally effective for reporting periods beginning after June 15, 2016, with earlier application encouraged. Additional information regarding implementation timing is available in the document.

GASB ISSUES ENHANCED GUIDANCE ON IRREVOCABLE SPLIT-INTEREST AGREEMENTS

March 29, 2016—Under a typical irrevocable split-interest agreement, a donor transfers assets for the shared benefit of at least two beneficiaries: a government (often a public college, university, or hospital) and another donor-designated beneficiary. The donor transfers the related assets to either the government or to a separate third party, such as a bank.

GASB Statement No. 81, Irrevocable Split-Interest Agreements, addresses when these types of arrangements constitute an asset for accounting and financial reporting purposes when the resources are administered by a third party. The Statement also provides expanded guidance for circumstances in which the government holds the assets.

"The types of agreements addressed by Statement 81 can represent significant resources for certain public colleges, universities, and hospitals," said GASB Chair David A. Vaudt. "This guidance will lead to more consistent accounting for these agreements, which will allow users access to more comparable information about them."

The requirements of GASB Statement 81 are effective for reporting periods beginning after December 15, 2016. The full text of the Statement is available at www.gasb.org.transactions, nonlease components embedded in lease contracts (such as service agreements), and related-party leases.

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
