The spring Early Careers Breakfast and Job Shadow event was another huge success! During the fall breakfast we had 26 individuals attend (a record high). This spring we came very close to matching our record with 22 individuals attending the breakfast/information session to learn about the job shadow program. Of the 22 people who attended, 73% expressed interest in learning about and possibly joining our AGA chapter. Two of those individuals completed the registration to become new members!

After the informational breakfast, the Early Career's committee worked individually with the seven participants to learn more about their interests and who they would like to shadow. With this information the committee was able to match each individual with a manager in their desired business area for a four hour shadow. At the end of the shadowing experience, members were asked to fill out a brief report helping our committee better meet the needs of AGA members in the future. The Bi-Annual Joint AGA/ASMC Professional Development took place on May 14, 2015 at the Garrison Hotel and Conference Center. Over 200 attendees participated as speakers from diverse backgrounds took front and center, presenting a myriad of topics. Some of the highlights included Dr. Byron Ernest, the Head of Schools at Hoosier Academy. After providing "homework" to the audience prior to the conference, he proceeded to go through a Mt. Everest Case Study hitting on key points. The study provided the key lessons such as the importance of preparedness and having assigned roles to increase team cohesion.



The keynote speaker was Keith Floyd, an ex-NCAA college football coach who preached the message of having a planned positive attitude. One piece of his message included goalsetting and the significance of having short, midrange, and long-

OPM Security Breech

WASHINGTON (AP) — As many as 14 million current and former civilian U.S. government employees had their personal information exposed to hackers, according to two people who were briefed on the investigation, a far higher figure than the 4 million the Obama administration initially disclosed.

The newer estimates put the number of compromised records at between 9 million and 14 million going back to the 1980s, said one congressional official and one former US official, who spoke to The Associated Press on condition of anonymity because information disclosed in the confidential briefings includes classified details of the investigation.



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
