



#### About the AGA and the Montgomery /Prince George's County Chapter


# **Our Financials**

Total revenue amounted to \$19,042. During FY 2023, our primary source of revenues came from sponsorships (50%). All other areas as shown to the left and below made up significantly less sources of revenue. Membership Dues/Development at accounted for 29% of revenue, followed by Workshops accounted at 16%, our May Awards Dinner at 4%, and Other Revenue at 1%.


## FY24 Revenues

Total expenses amounted to \$18,369. This is approximately a 17% decrease in expenses as compared to FY 2023. This was most likely the impact of our decrease in revenue experienced during FY 2024. Most of our expenses came from our spring/winter workshops and PDT (47%), followed by our May Awards Dinner (18%) and Scholarships (16%).
