Program Description	Fraud poses a significant risk to the integrity of federal programs and erodes public trust in government (GAO-23-106567). Fraudsters are getting more efficient as they embrace technology for the bad. To counter this, federal agencies must become more technically savvy and use tools that embrace technology for the good. The federal government has grown in using data analytics to prevent, identify, and mitigate fraud. These innovations, including but not limited to AI, Machine Learning, and Large Language Models, promise to add rigor to program integrity at a time when fraud is on the GAO federal government high-risk list. This session will discuss innovations in the use of data analytics and fraud prevention and how to effectively engage human capital and technology in concert to prevent and mitigate fraud.
